

Here are some suggested questions you might like to use when reading with your child:

| <b>Make inferences from the text/Explain and justify inferences with evidence from the text</b> | <p>Which word tells you that...?</p> <p>Which words make the reader feel...?</p> <p>How do you know...?</p> <p>How can you tell that...?</p> <p>Explain why...</p> <p>Why is...?
