We are now settled into our first term and the children are really working hard. 6 Yew led our first class liturgy of the year with a wonderful reflection, demonstrating through their RE lessons how they are living out the Gospel values in their own lives. In particular, I called to mind 'servitude' and the story in Vatican News today of a young Pope Francis, who was on his way to a party and stopped by his parish church as he felt the need to go to confession. 'This was an experience of encounter for me: I found someone was waiting for me...after confession, I felt that something had changed. I was not the same. I had heard just like a voice, a call'. At St. Anselm's, we encourage the children to be open to Jesus' call in their journey of finding their true purpose, and 6 Yew beautifully portrayed how we can follow His teachings to guide us and enrich our own lives.

Reception: It has been wonderful to observe the children building new friendships and working collaboratively in small groups. This week the children have been very busy creating a self-portrait and sharing their special talents with the class. They have also enjoyed mark-making, exploring the outdoors and being active in PE and 10 at 10 on Wednesday when we did 10 minutes of exercise at 10am! Well done Reception!















Year 1: We have had yet another busy week in Year One. The children have become experts in understanding and applying the -s and -es suffix. We are so impressed with their understanding and how they are able to apply this to their writing with increased independence. The children also discussed the usefulness of lists and how they are used regularly in our everyday lives. We wrote lists about what can be seen in the attic and the children came up with some wondeful adjectives to describe the different objects.

The children got very active during National Fitness Day as we danced along to some classic hits such as the Cha Cha slide. We all had a great time including the teachers as they took a trip down memory lane. We have lots of impressive dancers in Year One!

In RHE we discussed the Zones of Regulation and the best tools to use to self regulate. The children were able to articulate clearly which zone they would place themselves and why.

Year 2: We have had another really busy week in Year 2.

In RE, we are learning about God's chosen people. This we learnt that God chose Abraham and he trusted God to guide him.

In Science, we are learning about animals needs for survival and this week we focused on birds.


In PE, our focus is gymnastics and the children were excited to explore a variety of equipment in different ways.







Year 3: In PE, we had another amazing gymnastics session, we explored balance and control with handstands and forward rolls. In maths we have been using place value counters and part-whole models to flexibly partition to 1000. On Wednesday, we celebrated "National Fitness Day" with lots of fun and energetic exercises.









Year 4: In DT this week the children went on a scavenger hunt! In preparation for designing their book cover, they learnt about different fastenings, for example, toggles, zips, velcro, stud buttons, zips and belts. They were amazed to discover how many of these fastenings are used on their own belongings. They also discussed advantages and disadvantages of each fastening.









In English this week, Year 4 planned and acted out role plays to prepare them for writing their setting narrative. The children imagined they were whale spotters, trying to find the elusive whale!







Year 5: This half-term in D&T, we are learning about bridge structures. This week we have been finishing off our spaghetti truss bridges. We will test how strong they are and think about how we can improve our structure when we build our wooden bridges. On Wednesday in PE we were learning about counter balance which was a lot of fun as we got to work in pairs and create different counter balances.









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Year 6: 'On Thursday, 6 Yew did a Liturgy about the Kingdom of God. Everybody had a role and delivered it beautifully. All the parents and children attending were given a pebble to make a commitment to the Kingdom of God'. Olivia G (6 Yew)
