## 6<sup>th</sup> October 2023 Weekly Reflection

James 1:12



When we show perseverance, the world of possibilities is open to us, with Jesus there by our sides. Dear Parents, Carers and Children,

What a week it has been! Firstly, thank you to 5 Poplar for their wonderful liturgy on the Catholic value of 'perseverance'. They reflected on how Jesus persevered under trial ahead of his crucifixion and how they took strength from that in overcoming difficult times in their own lives. It calls to mind the story of little Nora, an 8 year old child, living in a children's home run by Mother Theresa's Sisters in war-torn Baghdad. Born without arms or legs, Nora fed the younger children with a spoon in her mouth. Eight year old Nora, with so little, reminding us that by persevering, we can do anything and love shows us the way.

**International Week:** A huge thank you to Mrs Howell for organizing all the wonderful activities the children have participated in this week, including the fantastic French 'Sing-Off' yesterday. Well done to 5 Rowan and 4 Oak who won the public vote for best performances.

**Year 2:** We have had another really busy week in Year 2. To celebrate International Week, we had a dance workshop where we learnt a very exciting Turkish routine.

We also learnt lots about a very famous tennis player called Novak Djokovic and the children were amazed to find out that heis fluent in lots of different languages.

In Art we painted pictures in the style of Serbian artist Nadezda Petrovic.
