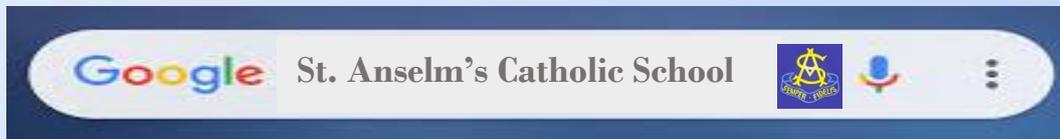

Keeping safe online - Personal information

What is personal information?

It is any information about you that can identify you (let other people know who you are).

It includes:

- Your name
- Email address
- Date of birth
- Where you live
- Who your friends and family are
- Where you go to school (including a photograph in your uniform)
- Your passwords for logins

This information is **personal** and **private** and that means that you **must not** share it with anybody that you meet online! If somebody asks you for any of this information, tell them that it is personal and you will not tell them and then tell a **trusted adult** who can help you!

A **trusted adult** could be somebody at school (your teachers, the online safeguarding lead, Mrs Collyer) or somebody at home who looks after you.

What have we been learning about in school?

This term, all classes are covering the online safety topic: **Self Image and Identity**. Reception will look at what is meant by self-identity: the way we look and our personality. In Year 1, you will talk about people who can sometimes make us feel sad online and knowing that we can ask them to stop and tell a trusted adult if this happens. Year 2 will look at how somebody's online identity can be different to their real identity and Year 3 will talk about the need to be careful when sharing information about themselves online and what information is not suitable to be shared online, as well of the risks of doing so. Year 4 will look at what a positive online identity is and how they can create one and Year 5 look at what a safe online profile would look like as well being able to identify personal information that you would not want to share. Year 6 learn how to make responsible choices about their identity and practise creating a safe online profile.

Challenge: We will soon be appointing new digital leaders in Years 5 and 6. Think about any apps and games you play at home that you would like some advice and help with keeping safe when using them. The new digital leaders will come and find out this information from you.
