## Keeping safe online - Personal information

### What is personal information?

It is any information about you that can identify you (let other people know who you are).

It includes:

- Your name
- Email address
- Date of birth
- Where you live
- Who your friends and family are
- Where you go to school (including a photograph in your uniform)
- Your passwords for logins

This information is **personal** and **private** and that means that you **must not** share it with anybody that you meet online! If somebody asks you for any of this information, tell them that it is personal and you will not tell them and then tell a **trusted adult** who can help you!

A **trusted adult** could be somebody at school (your teachers, the online safeguarding leads, Mrs Millar and Mrs Kelly-Keagan) or somebody at home who looks after you.

Remember the age limit for Snapchat is **13**.

Be brave and speak up. If you ever see anything online that makes you feel bad or uncomfortable, report it immediately and then talk about it with an adult you trust. This can be your mom, dad, aunt, uncle, older sibling, guardian, or teacher. Here are some types of behavior you should report:
