Dear Parents, Carers and Children, it has been another busy week and we are well into the swing of things at St. Anselm's. The work that children are producing is a real testament to their hard work and enthusiasm for learning. It is great to see. I would like to thank 6 Willow class for their wonderful liturgy yesterday on our Catholic Social Teaching strand, 'caring for creation'. They reflected on the parable of the mustard seed; how Jesus' message started as a tiny seed and then grew in to the world community we have today. We can make a huge difference in caring for our world, starting with just a small idea that grows and grows. Thank you to 6 Willow and Miss Barton for reminding us that our small gestures can make a big difference in the world.

**Reception Parent Information Session:** Thank you to our Reception teachers and all the parents who attended the information session this week. Our reception children have settled into the school routines so well, so thanks to the staff for all their hard work.

October – Month of the Rosary: In October, we are guided by Mary in reflecting on the life of Jesus. St. Don Bosco had a dream at the age of nine where he was confronted by a number of misbehaving children. He reacted by wading in and shouting at them. A stranger then appeared and said to him: 'You will have to win these friends of yours not by anger but by gentleness and love'. He was promised a teacher in Jesus' mother, Mary, under whose guidance he could act with love. **Year 1:** We have had another busy week in Year One. We have been particularly impressed with the standard of English produced. The children have been able to confidendelty identify the difference between a prefix and a suffix which is very impressive for this stage in the year! Towards the end of the week the children produced wonderful pieces of written work describing Old Bear and the environment in the attic. We were so impressed by the writing that we saw, it was full of fantastic adjectives, the use of the prefix 'un' alongside the use of conjunctions. Keep up the hard work children in English as it is really paying off and you are all wonderful writers. We are also very proud of how the standard of handwriting is progressing!

In RHE this week ahead of international week we designed some African Masks. The children were ever so creative with their designs, they are very coloruful and well thought out.

In Maths we have been focusing on comparing numbers with particular focus on the more than, less than and equal to symbols. We found this rather challanging at first but the children persevere and were a lot more confident towards the end of the week!


In RE this week we discussed different ways that we could look after God's World. The children were very thoughtful in their responses which highlighted that they are wonderful stewards of our World. The children suggested that we should:

**Year 2:** We have had another really busy week in Year 2.

In History, we have been learning why the Great Fire spread so quickly and why it stayed alight for so long.

In English, we are reading 'A River' which tells the story of a young boy who sets off on an adventurous journey. We have used this inspiration to write our own Circular Narrative describing our experiences and emotions along the way.

In D&T, we have been very busy as we have finally started to make our own fire engines!









**Year 3:** It was 'Cycle to School' week this week! In PSHE we wrote letters to Rishi Sunak PM explaining why we should cycle to school. In DT, we have continued to construct our castles using the 3D shapes we constructed ourselves. In PE we have been playing Netball and learning how to cartwheel in gymnastics.











**Year 4**: This week 4 Pine created a beautiful Collective Worship which took place in our stunning prayer garden. The theme of our liturgy was 'Creation', where a reading from the Book of Genesis was read. The children then refelected on why it is so important to protect our world and ways in which we can help to preserve its wonder.










This week, 4 Oak really enjoyed learning about animal classification keys in our Science lesson. We even created our own classification keys in partners.
