Dear Parents, Carers and Children, I cannot believe how quickly this first half term has gone. I must say, it's been an absolute joy seeing the children flourish in all their learning opportunities, both academic and with the wider curriculum. Our choir created a wonderful musical piece which they performed in a special baroque concert up at St. Mary's chapel on the hill yesterday. And 4 Pine reminded us in their liturgy this morning that when we work together to care for our creation, we can make a difference. Thank you 4 Pine and Mrs Dal Cin for your important message about our Catholic Social Teaching underpinning everything we do here at St. Anselm's.

October – Month of the Rosary: Thank you to the families who have joined us throughout this month to pray the rosary. This is a special time for us to join together in prayer as a community and send our prayers to all those who need them, so thank you for taking the time out of your days to join us. And thank you to Mrs Kelly-Keegan for leading the sessions. We will resume them in May with our GIFT team leading them.

**Signing Hail Mary:** In this week's liturgy, I set the children (and adults) an Autumn challenge of learning to sign the Hail Mary prayer. Signing is such a wonderfully inclusive way to communicate and it enables children to use their multi-sensory skills to reflect on the actual words they are reciting. **French Sing-Off:** A big thank you to Mr Pugh, our IT technician, for editing together our St. Anselm's 2023 KS2 French sing-off which is now available to watch on Share point. We hope you all enjoy it!

**Baroque Music and Songwriting Workshop:** The children who attend choir on Thursdays took part in a wonderful workshop this week in school, learning about Baroque instruments and music through the theme of nature. By the end of the workshop, they had written a song which was performed along with songs written by some other schools at a very special concert in St Mary's church on Wednesday evening.

**Parent Forum**: All parents are invited to a presentation and coffee morning on Friday 10 November from 9.00 – 11.30am. We will have guest speakers talking about Supporting and Including Children with Social Communication Needs (including Autism). Dr Rif Malik (Educational Psychologist) and Nicola Keohane (Specialist Autism teacher) will lead a session on information sharing- good practice and inclusion and there will also be an opportunity to have refreshments, ask questions and chat to other parents.

**Drop-off and Pick-up Safeguarding:** Now that the children are familiar with routines for arriving at and leaving school, we would like to ask parents to observe the following safeguarding points around the school grounds, to ensure our children are kept safe at all times:

- Parents requiring the office to use the front entrance only (not via the playground);
- Children to drop off and collect scooters and bikes from the scooter park independently;
- No parents to enter the school building other than via the front office.

**Reception & Year 1 Parent Phonics Workshop:** There will be a phonics workshop taking place on the 24th November 9-10am to discuss how phonics is taught at school and how you can support your children at home.

**School Newsletter:** We are looking at moving our school newsletters to Microsoft Sway – an online platform which forms part of our SharePoint system. This will be sent to you as an internet link via ParentPay which you can simply tap on to view the latest newsletter. This all works from the internet browser on your device and does not require any additional software to be installed. We will update you when we are due to release our first Sway newsletter.

Inclusion: Friday 20 October is National Developmental Language Disorder (DLD) Awareness day. Children with DLD can have significant difficulty learning, understanding, and using spoken language. DLD can be a lesser known disability. People with DLD may make more errors or use simpler sentences or even have trouble organising a conversation. These problems are not always obvious to the non-specialist. 2. DLD emerges in early childhood but persists into adulthood. 3. DLD affects people around the world, no matter the language spoken. 4. DLD affects approximately 1 in 14 children and can affect social and emotional well-being as well as success at school and work. We attach some facts sheets for those who want to find out more.

**Year 1:** We have had a jam packed week in Year One finishing up all the wonderful work we have been doing this half term. We were so impressed by the windmills that the children created. They had the opportunity to go outside and test them which was a great success! We look forward to seeing the fantastic artwork they will produce next half term.

In Mathematics, we began looking at word problems in greater depth, we were very impressed with how the children decoded the questions in order to answer the questions well. They enjoyed using multilink when working out the addition and subtraction problems.

In English we looked at three different suffixes; -ed, -ing and -er. The children were able to understand and apply this well to sentnences. We were impressed with their understanding and look forward to seeing children to use their understanding of suffixes well in their writing.

We have throughly enjoyed getting to know all the children this half term and can't wait to welcome you all back again soon!







**Year 2:** We have had another really busy week in Year 2. We celebrated Black History Month by 'Saluting Our Sisters' and exploring the remarkable achievements of black women across the globe. We were excited to find out that a statue of Mary Seacole sits outside St Thomas' Hospital in London and is believed to be the first in the Uk to honour a black woman.

In English, we have been writing letters to the main character in our class book to warn him of the dangers he may face on his voyage.

In RE, we have been learning about Judaism as part of other faiths week. We also concluded our learning of The Great Fire of London and finished our fire engines.




